KEYNOTE SPEAKERS





Danijel Pavlović is an associate professor at Singidunum University, Serbia. His main area of research includes tourism destination competitiveness, the business of travel agencies and tour operators and religious tourism. He is a member of the Serbian Marketing Association; The Coordination Commission for Inspection Supervision - and the Sectoral Council for the Trade, Hospitality and Tourism Sector (NOKS) -The agency for Qualifications, Government of the Republic of Serbia; and a member of the Editorial Board of International Journal of Religious Tourism and Pilgrimage (IJRTP), regional editor for Europe of the Journal of Islamic Tourism (JIT) and a member of the SITCON Conference Scientific and Organising Board.

Dr Minna Opas is Professor of Study of Religion (fixed-term), University of Turku, Finland. She is Director of the Centre for the Study of Christian Cultures (cscc.utu.fi) and co-editor in-chief of Temenos: Nordic Journal of Comparative Religion. She is interested in questions related to the anthropology of Christianity and indigenous religions and cultures.

Polyxeni Moira, is Professor in Sociology of Tourism at the Department of Tourism Management, University of West Attica in Greece. She was also a Visiting Professor at the University of Ioannina, Harokopeion University, University of Aegean, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens and the Hellenic Open University. She holds a PhD in Sociology from Panteion University of Political and Social Sciences, Greece. She has published 20 scientific books ("Religious Tourism and Pilgrimage", "Marine Tourism", "Cruise Tourism", "Industrial Heritage Tourism") in the field of tourism and articles in more than 50 international and Greek journals. Her research interest includes Sociology of Tourism, Consumers Behavior in Tourism, and Religious Tourism.

The Finnish Archipelago Sea in the southwest of Finland is situated in the Baltic Sea and comprises the area west of Hanko peninsula, south of Turku, the former capital of Finland, and stretches all the way to the autonomous and demilitarized Åland Islands halfway between Finland's and Sweden's mainland. Of the over 40,000 islands in the region, around 350 are inhabited all around the year, while some 5000 islands have summer cottages on them.



The conference takes place in the Archipelago City of Pargas, south Finland's largest city by area and the only city totally situated on islands outside mainland Finland. Get here by using the numerous daily flights to Helsinki-Vantaa airport from where the area is reachable in just over three hours by train and bus. Alternatively, use Turku airport from where



The Archipelago National park stretching out all the way to the southernmost skerries and lighthouse islands is of outstanding beauty and protects the sensitive biotopes and is a habitat for wild animals and like seals, sea eagles and many species of wading birds. The culture and way of life in the numerous island villages and communities is modern but exceptional in its dependence on the ferries and long routes to schools, work and services for many.

the area is reachable in under two hours by bus. The area has good roads and good traffic conditions - renting a car at one of the airports to get around provides a lot of possibilities to take in sights. We will publish detailed information about accommodation and transportation on the conference webpages.

The official languages in Finland are Finnish and Swedish, with Swedish being the majority language in the archipelago area. English is widely spoken.

The Archipelago Trail is a 250 km ring route, accessible by bicycle, car or foot using the numerous bridges and ferries connecting the main islands, and is the best known touristic route in Finland. Through projects like the St Olav Waterway, the St Olav Pilgrimage route has been developed to take pilgrim hikers through the archipelago, on foot, by kayak and with sailing vessels on their way towards Norwegian Trondheim.

The conference will take place on the island of Korpo (Finnish: Korppoo), connected with mainland Finland by bridges and free car ferries with four departures per hour. As the villages and services are small in scale, accommodation will be arranged around the area with transportation arranged to the main conference facilities.
